## October 2023 Report from Spiritual Life Pillar, Fred Chandler, Pillar Head

Bible Study: Jay Kiesler. The parish will offer a four-session presentation on the Eucharist in preparation for the National Eucharistic Congress this spring or early summer. In addition, the Bible Study group will be starting a study of the Book of Isaiah this spring. The study will be 12 weeks, 6 weeks the spring of 2024 and 6 weeks the fall of 2024.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Children's Liturgy of the Word: We had **88 children** participate on Sunday, Dec. 3. Thankfully, the catechists had decided in advance to split the group into two age groups to better accommodate their needs. This worked out wonderfully and will continue moving forward. Several parents have stepped in to help.

Religious Ed: We are back to pre-pandemic numbers with <u>40 kiddos</u> enrolled in our Sunday morning religious education program.

Eucharistic Ministers/Greeters/Lectors/Musicians: Eleven people signed up to be trained as Ems during the Ministry Fair. Commissioning of EMs is scheduled on December 9-10. Blessing of Greeters, Musicians and Servers will take place on December 16-17. The blessing of Lectors will be on January 13-14.

Ministry to the Homebound: This ministry is suspended for the time being.

Centering Prayer: The group continues to meet at 6:00 p.m. on Thursdays.

Morning prayer: Bill Scott. The Morning Prayer group is still going strong. The group continues to meet weekdays at 7:45 in the Bosler Chapel and typically have a group of 4-6 people. The gatherings last 15-20 minutes.

RCIA: Karla Hudecek. <u>Six adults</u> are preparing to receive the sacraments of initiation on Holy Saturday. That number is at least double what we have had in each of the past 4 years.

#### Retreats for men and women:

Sacramental Prep: <u>Confirmation</u> - Thirteen teens are preparing for Confirmation on May 1. They had an engaging and fun retreat at CYO Camp Rancho Framasa Nov. 11-12. <u>First Reconciliation/Communion</u> - 32 children will have their First Reconciliation Thursday, Dec. 7. First Communion will be May 5. <u>Baptism</u> - 23 infants and children have been baptized so far this year, with 7 pending. That's four more than in 2019. At the November 30 Liturgy Committee meeting Julie Sherer reported that she had a conversation with a priest familiar with young people being prepared for sacraments. It was his observation that St. Thomas Aquinas has the best sacramental preparation program in the archdiocese. Congratulations to Karla for receiving this unsolicited praise!

Youth Ministry: Efforts are underway to have more youth Masses.

Vacation Bible School: SCUBA VBS – Diving into Friendship with God – will be June 17-21, 2024.

Liturgy Committee: Mary Rice and Julie Niec have taken over as co-chairs of the group. Preparations will soon begin for Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024. The North Deanery Advent Penance Service will be hosted by STA on Sunday, December 17, at 2:00 pm.

Eucharistic Revival: The **10th National Eucharistic Congress** (NEC) will be held on **July 17-21**, **2024**, in Indianapolis, primarily at Lucas Oil Stadium and in surrounding venues. As the defining event of a five-year

National Eucharistic Revival, the NEC is an opportunity for Catholics across the United States to be "healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist"—and then to be sent out on mission, newly inspired and "on fire" with the love of Christ and His Holy Spirit.

## Parish Council Report: November 30, 2023

- Fiscal year 2023-24 giving was 1.7% lower than prior fiscal year-to-date this covers July-October 2023.
- Noah delivered annual financial update to parish on weekend of October 28-29, emphasizing expectation that each parish household contribute \$25 per week (\$1,300 annually) to Sunday collections to support operations of parish.
- Cash balance and tuition revenue higher than expected due to receipt of Choice tuition funds.

# STA Finance Committee Meetings – November 21 and October 17, 2023 Financial Statements Update

- Collections were 16% below budget for fiscal year (at this time last year we were 26% below budget). Budget corresponds to target of \$25/week per registered household.
- Sanctuary HVAC repairs to take place shortly; insurance will cover costs beyond \$5,000 deductible.

#### **New Business**

- SausageFest final net income: \$174,000.
- School budgeting updates: propose to make part-time guidance counselor full-time; new archdiocese preschool standards may require upgrades to a classroom; looking to purchase some new classroom supplies (specifically art).
- Creation Care led discussion on Laudato Si' action platform, discussed items including sustainability of fundraisers, portfolio of investments held at archdiocese, dealing with spikes in school energy use that generate additional charges to bill.
- Father and Matt requested that committee make available to parish at large most of detail provided to parish council as part of annual financial report.
- Geoff Ziegler proposed trivia night fundraiser to benefit parish general fund. Date has yet to be determined. Expected net revenue is \$3,500.
